Recently Tammy and I received a note from a non-member of SOV stating "We are thrilled to participate in your Building Fund. Shepherd of the Valley is very important to us. You have very Special Members".

And so it is – the people of Shepherd of the Valley are very special people.

When Pastor Kurt was still with us, in the early days of our building committee work, when we had no monies for the early survey work, soil studies, etc, Four families stepped up and provided major 'seed money' for the beginning of the future of SOV and our building of a new sanctuary. I do not have permission from them to tell you their names however these are very Special People and when we say our prayers at night we should thank God for these un-named people and their unselfish gift given anonymously.

As of July 13th the People of Shepherd of the Valley have committed \$334,145.00 by way of 58 response cards. As you know our target for the Capital Funds campaign over three years is \$500,000 so you all are on your way to realizing this goal.

Your Executive Council currently is depositing these funds in the Banner Bank Building Fund account and continues to look at the advantages of a separate investment account for these funds while establishing controls over the account.

John Cross of KAIROS is planning to visit Shepherd of the Valley sometime in August and will be available to answer any questions anyone may have.

Thanks be to God for the members of Shepherd of the Valley.

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MICHELLE

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I write this, we are nearing the end of July, and the congregation of Shepherd of the Valley is preparing to meet two candidates for the position of pastor. It's an exciting time to be part of the life of Shepherd of the Valley! Meeting the candidates is an important step in the process of discerning whether either of these pastors is the right fit for the congregation. I hope that many of you will have the opportunity to be present and to share your impressions with the Call Committee. Please don't be shy about asking questions! Also, please remember to hold the Call Committee members, the candidates, and the whole congregation in prayer. The members of the Call Committee are: Arden Tarum, chair; Daniel Carlson; Valsala George; Joe Hoffbeck; Connie McFall; Linda Rasmussen; Lee Bonacker (alternate); Dick Kuykendall (alternate).

The fact that you are finally getting to meet candidates is exciting, but we should all bear in mind that this is one step in the discernment process. In other words, it's not yet a "done deal" that one of these two pastors will become the next pastor of SOV. It's possible that one of them will be a good match for the people and programs of the congregation, but it's also possible that God hasn't yet put forward the person who is the best match. So, we all need to trust the guidance of the Holy Spirit, who works through the call process, and we need to keep lifting everyone up in prayer!... The story of the prophet Samuel's anointing of King David reminds us that our view of leadership must always be discerned in light of God's way of seeing: David was the youngest and smallest of all of Jesse's sons, and he wasn't even present in the house when Samuel came to anoint the next king; at the Lord's direction, David, who was out tending the flocks, had to be called into the house so that he could be anointed king.

Following the meet and greet events, your Call Committee members will meet to discuss the feedback they've received about the candidates. Based on the feedback they've received and on their own impressions, they will determine what the next step will be. This step could be recommending one of the candidates to the Church Council for consideration for call to SOV. It could also be that the committee will decide that neither of these candidates is a good match. If the latter is the case, then the candidates will be released from consideration, the bishop will be notified, and the Call Committee will start fresh with a new slate of candidates.

Transition can be exciting, but it can also be a time of great anxiety, as we wonder: "What's next? What will the new pastor be like? When will this transition happen?, etc." Many of us have a tendency to want to resist transition. You know that old joke about Lutherans? "Q: How many Lutherans does it take to change a light bulb? A: It's an irrelevant question, because Lutherans don't believe in change!..." And yet, here we are on the brink of a big change! Yet in the big picture of life, it's just one of many changes we face. To paraphrase one of my favorite theologians, Walter Brueggemann: We yearn for stability and think change is not the norm, but in reality transition is the norm...and that's okay, because God is in charge!

Here at Shepherd of the Valley God's people look to the future with all our hopes and all our anxieties, trusting that God is in charge and that God is preparing wonderful things for the congregation. You are a caring and gifted community, and I pray that you will be blessed with a pastor who will complement your strengths and help you grow in love for God and for each other.

OUTREACH FOR JUNE


We spent 82 hours and 632 miles on our projects. We were given \$400 in furniture, clothing, etc.

We gave 8 food baskets at a cost of \$188, spent \$50 on refugees and \$74 on fire victims.

We are now starting to work on backpacks. The sales have started. We have been given the backpacks but we need money for the contents. Thrivent is giving us \$500, but in order to fill the backpacks, we will need another \$500. Please mark your checks "Backpacks—Social Concerns."

We got only 2 requests from fire victims and they seemed happy with the things we gave them. We got a nice thank you.

VBS was a successful event that entertained and educated the children that attended as well as the youth and adult volunteers that worked countless hours to make it happen. Many thanks to our directors, Lisa and Tom Ramsey-Barnes, all the teachers, volunteers and parents for creating this wonderful program for all our children that attended our VBS program this year.

For a couple of years we have talked about investigating what we could do to help create a better opportunity to assist those with hearing loss we now have a new system ordered! We received \$1300 from Thrivent to help fund this project. James Graham, Arden Tarum and Matt Kotvis worked together to research our options. Through Matt's business, we were able to obtain a system that will have the capacity to help eight people with a listening device to help make worship a more pleasant experience. The equipment is on order and will arrive within two weeks!

The committee decided to go for the maximum that our charger will allow in order to plan for our future. This system allows us to add units if congregational needs for these units increase. Through donations, we will be able to cover the extra \$137 to make this available for up to eight people a service. This group of volunteers worked hard to obtain the very best possibility for our church and we saved over 50% through Matt Kotvis professional discount! We appreciate each of our committee's time and energy in helping us bring a dream to reality!

The Call Committee is setting up our "meet and greet" fellowship and devotional times with the two candidates that they have selected to bring to the congregation for further consideration. As the August newsletter is being prepared, these arrangements are being finalized. This is a very special committee to serve and the time and energy that is required of each member is very appreciated and valued. Our committee is Arden Tarum, Daniel Carlson, Joe Hoffbeck, Dick Kuykendall, Lee Bonacker, Connie McFall, Linda Rasmussen, and Valsala George. Please take time to talk to these members of our Call Committee. Ask questions, share your ideas, show your interest and most of all, support and pray for them as well as the candidates that are interested in serving SOV.

August 3, at the end of our early service and the beginning of our late service, Pastor Michelle will be installing our new Executive Committee and all council committee members. Per our constitution, each elected committee group chooses their council representative yet if that person has to be absent from council, any one of the elected committee can represent their committee as a voting member. We want to celebrate the commitment of all our council and committee members as we continue into a new program year.
