
# YOUTH GROUP NEWS...

#### COUNCIL PRESIDENTS REPORT...Submitted by Lee Bonacker

Hello Everyone,

This article got started by looking at this same report for last year. At this time last year, we had not yet installed the siding and the windows. What a difference now! There are still some items on the wish list, such as new ADA compatible front doors. Jeff has been collecting bids and donations for the doors have already provided about half of the funds needed. We didn't have a better organ or a new sign either – we are being so blessed in physical ways, much less emotional and spiritual ones.

Like last year, VBS was a great success. As usual, Parish Ed did a great job and we are fortunate to have such talented and creative people to put the program together. The pictures of all the activity are guaranteed to make you smile.

In August, there will be another annual opportunity to participate in Packed with Love. Tammy will be forwarding the details for this excellent activity.

Last year, the Strategic Planning Task Force had not been formed. The last planning effort took place in 2003 under Cal's organization as is also being done this year. The Task Force is polishing up its draft with the hopes of being able to present the document to Council in August. The plan will be made available to the congregation for your comments, probably through several avenues like email and hard copies. The Task Force members will figure out distribution and how to synthesize comments once the editing on this first version is finished.

Continuing from last year (and from much earlier) is the need to resolve the easement issue. Leaving the easement issue hanging isn't an option for Shepherd because of interfering with normal functioning much less any expansion plans for the future. For example, as things stand now it would be unclear which part of the parking lot should/could be repaired.

At July's Council meeting, Council gave the direction to resolve the easement issue as quickly as possible through whatever means necessary. To that end, a meeting with the attorney is being set up for the first week of August. The most important question to ask him is what he needs from Shepherd to get the fastest resolution. There are a number of other questions as well. It's time to put the issue to rest, as difficult as it has been. Thank you to Reynold, Dave, Peggy, Jack, Jim, Arden and all the people who have worked on this problem over time. Let's all pray for an efficient resolution.

#### **ADA DOOR UPDATE**

SOV Front doors

Most of you are aware that we currently have door latching issues. The front doors (which happen to be the originals) have become warped or will bow with changes in our climate. Thank you to Arden and Staff whom have made numerous adjustments over the months to correct the latching problems as they arise.



To replace our front doors with a set of decorative doors, the breakdown is as follows:

1 - oversized exterior double door unit, (Suburban Door Company) comprised of 3/4 etched glass and 1/4 door: \$2,255.66.

Installation of double doors and hardware. Includes: 1) ADA access = motorized door opener for handicap accessibility, 2) move card key entry card access\* to new door, 3) new door closer's, 4) new hinges. 5) new exit door devices. \$6,200.00.

Electrical: \$500.00

\* Card key electric latch may require additional hardware or different operating system. \$500.00.

Total: \$9,455.60.

NEXT MEETING: Our next meeting is Thursday August 9th at 11 A.M. at SOV. We meet the second Thursday of each month at the same time and location. This information is also listed on the kiosk in the narthex and on our Website church calendar. Join us!

TECHNOLOGY STUFF: The church directory will soon be available to all members on our SOV website. Our goal is a September start date. This program will be password protected and members must contact the SOV secretary to obtain their beginning password to gain access. MEMBERS CAN OPT OUT OF HAVING THEIR INFORMATION LISTED BY CONTACTING THE SOV SECRETARY. Members also have options as to what information they want included. Currently the same information that is on our printed directory (and available in the narthex) is on the new website directory. Future plans include offering the option of adding in professional/interest information along with website links. So members could click on the link and go directly to a professional or interest sight. Contact us if you have questions or concerns.

DATA COLLECTION FROM OUR WEBSITE: The committee has identified four targeted areas of our website for data collection. They are: Our 'Home Page' (currently getting an average of 10 contacts per day); our 'Visit Us' page (currently getting an average of 2 contacts per day); the pod casts (getting average of 10 contacts per week); and Kids of the Kingdom Pre-School (getting and average of 3 contacts per day). The plan is to track these contacts and begin to use this information for planning. Our goal is to tell our community the story of SOV and how we are putting God's word into action. Are we being effective?

MEALS TO MEMBERS: Ginny Adamo has graciously agreed to help organize the offering of meals to SOV members who are ill. Shepherd has had several folks who are recovering from health problems this summer. If you are feeling called to participate, contact our SOV secretary with your interest. Ginny and Tammy are working together on this mission.
