

# Pastor Brian's Message

I met with the Evangelism Committee a few weeks ago. We got to talking about prayer. We decided it would be good to promote prayer at SOV. Evangelism is not just reaching out to engage people in the life of a nonprofit institution. It's more about sharing our faith, our hope, our heart set on God — which is the whole reason for us to exist as a nonprofit institution. So, in the coming year you'll notice a greater emphasis on prayer at SOV, because prayer is all about strengthening our connection with God. When we attend to our own connection with God, we are better equipped to share our heart for God with others.

Here's a word from St. Paul about prayer: "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." (Phil. 4:6)

Here's some practical guidance on prayer — courtesy of a book sometimes used by our Confirmation students: *Here We Stand (Student Book)*. It's full of wisdom that's as good for adults as it is for teens.

#### **HOW TO PRAY**

Prayer is intimate communication with God and can be used before a meal, at bedtime, during a worship service, or any time the need or opportunity arises. Silent and spoken prayers are both okay and may be used liberally throughout the day. Prayer is also taking time to listen to what God is saying to us. Spontaneous prayer is often best, but the following process may help build the habit.

<u>Assess your need for prayer</u>. Take stock of the situation at hand, including your motivations. What are you praying for and why?

<u>Select a type of prayer</u>. Prayers of *supplication* (requests for God's help), *contrition* (in which sin is confessed and forgiveness requested), *intercession* (on behalf of others), and others are good and time tested. Books of personal prayers, hymnals, and devotions often contain helpful, prewritten prayers. Consider also an ad-libbed prayer from the heart.

<u>Select a physical prayers posture</u>. Many postures are appropriate. The most common type of prayer in the New Testament is from a prone position, lying face-down on the ground, arms spread. Kneeling with your face and palms upturned is good for prayers of supplication. Bowed head with closed eyes and hands folded is common today and aids concentration. There is no official posture for prayer. Choose your posture according to your individual prayer needs.

Offer your prayer. Pray with confidence. God listens to all prayer and responds. Breathe deeply, relax, and be open as the Spirit leads you.

<u>Listen</u>. Take time during your prayer simply to listen. Some prayer traditions involve only silent meditation as a means of listening for God's voice.

<u>Be aware</u>. God hears every prayer. Prayer can be done either alone or in the company of others. Environment matters. If possible, consider lighting a candle and dimming the lights to set the correct mood and help block out distractions.

Concluding remarks from St. Paul: "And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." (Phil. 4:7)
