

The lot partition extension has been approved, as expected. So that extension will provide more time to try to resolve the Lazy Boy easement encroachment problem. Please do pray for a speedy solution to the problem. Wouldn't that be a lovely Christmas present for SOV?

We look forward to the blessing that this unexpected rental income will provide for the budget, but also getting together with them for some fellowship activities. The fellowship committee will have the details on that, so I'll let them fill you in.





Advent wreaths are attributed to Martin Luther (1483–1546), a German priest who initiated the Protestant Reformation, and they're designed using evergreen branches forming a never-ending circle.

The circle and the evergreen branches both symbolize the promise of eternal life through Christ. Four blue candles (replacing the former colors of purple & pink) are placed on the wreath, representing the four Sundays of Advent. The four blue candles symbolizing hope and the truth of Christ.



A fifth candle, generally white and placed in the center of the wreath, is the Christ candle and is lit on Christmas Eve in honor of His birth.

Pre-K News

We had lots of fun in November! We welcomed a new friend to our class and now we have eight friends to discover and enjoy what God has given us. We watched the weather and noticed the leaves changing color and falling from the trees. We painted leaves then stamped with them. We went on a nature walk and checked off items we found along the way. We collected leaves and made leaf men. We made scarecrows from shapes. We learned about forest animals and sampled foods that God has provided for them. prepared cornbread muffins and invited our families to a lunchtime Thanksgiving feast. We learned new songs about squirrels, scarecrows, the harvest, turkeys, and being thankful to God. We talked about what it means to be thankful and made a list of what God has given us. We made a book about the forest and animals that live there. We learned about the fruits of the Spirit and how we can be more like Jesus. We decorated turkeys with our families and shared them with our friends at morning We learned new letters and sounds and are continuing counting and patterning. We will have several managers available so everyone will have an opportunity to play with baby Jesus. We will make stars and sheep. We will continue counting, patterning, weather watching and graphing. We will review letters we have learned and make a special nativity book to share with our families. We will make a special snack and share it with our friends in the Threes Class. We will also have special evening Christmas program and invite our families to share songs and the story of Jesus' birth. We will play outside as the weather permits and enjoy the world God has created for us.
