



#### The Role of Healthy Food in Promoting Brain Health - Think What You Eat

In an interesting article that appeared in *The New York Times* a few years ago, Nicholas Bakalar described a study at the University of Toronto which found that dogs fed a diet high in antioxidants and living in an enriched environment stayed smarter longer than the other group. ("It Can Be Done: Scientists Teach Old Dogs New Tricks." *New York Times*, January 25, 2005, sec. F, Science, 1.) It appears that what we eat does seem to make our brains feel and perform better, and foods that are high in antioxidants are the most promising.



The top 25 foods that are high on the ORAC (antioxidant) scale are: prunes, raisins, blueberries, blackberries, garlic, kale, cranberries, strawberries, raw spinach, raspberries, Brussels sprouts, plums, alfalfa sprouts, steamed spinach, broccoli, beets, avocados, oranges, red grapes, red peppers, cherries, kiwifruit, baked beans, pink grapefruit, and kidney beans. Red wine and black teas are good, too.

The Mediterranean diet (high in vegetables and olive oil) has been associated with longevity, as well, and the Mayo Clinic has a good description of this diet on their website: <a href="http://www.mayoclinic.com/health/mediterranean-diet/CL00011">http://www.mayoclinic.com/health/mediterranean-diet/CL00011</a>. People who eat this way, however, also generally have very healthy social lives and get more exercise than we do in North America, which are also protective factors for health.

Drinking enough water is important for the health of your brain, as is avoiding the types of beverages that are hard on your body, such as sugary drinks, too many caffeinated drinks, and too much alcohol. ## ADA DOOR UPDATE

SOV Front doors

Most of you are aware that we currently have door latching issues. The front doors (which happen to be the originals) have become warped or will bow with changes in our climate. Thank you to Arden and Staff whom have made numerous adjustments over the months to correct the latching problems as they arise.



To replace our front doors with a set of decorative doors, the breakdown is as follows:

1 - oversized exterior double door unit, (Suburban Door Company) comprised of 3/4 etched glass and 1/4 door: \$2,255.66.

Installation of double doors and hardware. Includes: 1) ADA access = motorized door opener for handicap accessibility, 2) move card key entry card access\* to new door, 3) new door closer's, 4) new hinges. 5) new exit door devices. \$6,200.00.

Electrical: \$500.00

\* Card key electric latch may require additional hardware or different operating system. \$500.00.

Total: \$9,455.60.
