



# COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S REPORT... Submitted by Terry Wagemann

#### Greetings All,

It's hard to believe that this is the last newsletter of the year. Lots going on and lots to do, so this month's article is a little random. In November we had our council retreat. It was a great success planning the church calendar for the coming year. The goal was to get all the church events written down so we can plan the year together as one large group. We listed events by month and by anchor committee, then, we linked events to our Strategic Plan. This gave us a chance to see what each month of the year looked like and whether we had any gaps or overloading. After the retreat, we obtained a copy of the Youth calendar and added it to the church calendar for a more complete picture. We average more than 9



church events per month, not counting worship services. And, we have another 12 church activities and 8 youth activities suggested, but not yet planned!

Looking at the Town Hall feedback from last month's newsletter, growing the church's membership and growing the youth/young families were the top 2 hopes recorded. These two hopes have been receiving a lot of attention at both Executive Council and Church Council. In addition to our present youth program with Stacey and Caitlin, we are working to create activities for the teenage youth between services. We are pleased to see a half-dozen or so teens on Sundays, so we're investing time and resources to address their needs.

When it comes to adding new members, we have been blessed over the past year with quite a few new members. Many of the new members have jumped right in by joining committees. It has been great to see our membership expanding with new members and existing members working together in the church. This is great because it ensures that we hear the voices of all members. And if anyone is looking for a place to get involved, one place that needs help is Children's Sunday School. We have teachers, but we still need some assistants in some classes. Helping for 1 or 2 Sundays per month would be a great help to the teachers. Please see Stacie Sandow or any of the Sunday School teachers.

Also at last month's council retreat, we began the annual budgeting process. We continued working on it at November's Council meeting and plan to finish it in December. As usual, costs are rising faster than contributions. One reason is that pledges are down. We also saw some membership changes in 2013 that are putting some burden on income. It's part of the natural cycle of life. One of the large components of the budget is the amount allocated to individual committees. This individual allocation allows committees to carry out the missions and ministries of our church, like creating and printing out bulletins, providing music for worship services, making food baskets for the local community, cleaning and repairing our facilities for all to use, teaching Sunday School, programs for the youth, and much more. As we look for ways to make up the income shortfall, please consider Shepherd in your end of year giving. If you wish to offer a gift for a specific committee or program, please feel free to mark your donation accordingly. The major committees and programs with established budgets are: Worship, Stewardship, Evangelism, Parish Ed., Fellowship, Social Concerns, Property Management, Health Team, and Youth.

Finally, I wish everyone a Blessed Christmas Season, and a Joyous New Year! Please take some time to slow down and enjoy the gift of the season.
