And I'll have time to enjoy the fact that I'm alive and well in God's amazing world, with all the beauty of Portland, its rivers and mountains all around. What a gift!

We are very blessed here at Shepherd of the Valley! Pastor Brian continues to lead us here as our Pastor in residence for the near future. We also have many good people sharing Christ's love throughout our community and within our church. Thank you to all of the committees and their members for continuing to work hard to keep SOV running smoothly.

We hope you had a fabulous Thanksgiving and loving times with your families. Christmas is coming SOON and there will be many opportunities to prepare for the coming of our messiah. There will be Advent Wednesday evening soup beginning at 5:30 pm followed by services. The evenings are December 3rd, 10th and 17th with Pastor Randy presiding.

Thanks to Social Concerns and all of the volunteers for funding, researching, shopping and preparing the 39 "baskets" (actually BIG boxes) for the HopeSpring women and children. There were as many as 150 people who were provided with food for this long Thanksgiving week. What an inspiring group of volunteers who showed Christ's love through action and the Holy Spirit.

The Facts from Lutheran Community Services and HopeSpring website:

Over 4000 children are homeless in Washington County each year.

Most homeless women and children have been victims of domestic violence.

Adequate education, support and financial assistance are necessary to break the cycle of poverty, violence, and homelessness.

Giving Thanks was a huge success! Again thanks to all the volunteers and Fellowship Committee for their efforts. We can't give Lyle a big enough thank you for all he provided! From the German sausage to the accordion playing we were well fed and serenaded with true hospitality.

One month at a time for Pastor Randy. He has returned at 20% of Full time or 8 hours a week (as recommended from his doctor) beginning November. He preached for two Sundays and adult bible studies between services along with Adult Bible studies on Wednesday. During December he will be preaching on Dec 7tj, and Christmas morning at 10 am and continuing with Adult Bible studies during December. 
Christmas Programs: Caroling December 7th meet at SOV and we will car pool to various sites.
