PASTOR'S PAGE

"Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me,'" Matthew 19:14

Those words of Jesus are ones that we return to again and again, for many reasons. Often times simply to remind us of the importance Jesus placed on children in a society that didn't necessarily hold them in high esteem. A good reminder for us as well. I recall them here because of something I want to share

with this church family.

Beginning last fall I attended a couple of meetings concerned with something called the "School Partnership Network". In short what this network is about is finding ways that churches can partner with local schools, building genuine relationships and helping the children of those schools through meaningful service. That service takes place in all sorts of ways of course, and some churches have already begun by doing grounds and building maintenance, gathering school supplies, clothes, food etc.

I met with the Principal and the Student Supervisor of McKinley Elementary on January 17th to talk about what their greatest needs are. This is a school that has a great many challenges with a relatively transitory population. There greatest need is for people who can spend some time in the class room, with the greatest need being with kindergarten through 2nd grade. That time in the class room might come in a variety of ways. Through math or reading groups, one on one time, sometimes just being present for and encouraging little ones.

How much time? Ideally, one hour, one day, a week. (Hopefully the same time every week.) That may seem like a lot, or maybe something doable. Think of this for now. There is just a little over 4 months of the school year left. That is a not a long commitment, but long enough to find out if this something that you as an individual, that we as a family of faith, can do together. This can be a grand way for us to "reach out".

If you have any interest, more questions, whatever, please let me know. We will also share more time talking about this, but the desire is to respond quickly, get necessary back ground checks done, and meet with the school folks and find out how we can make a difference in many lives.

Hello Everyone,

It's a brand new year with brand new opportunities and expectations. (I expect to continue breaking some of the resolutions I made for 2013 – namely the dietary ones...) Shepherd starts off this year with a strategic plan, and healthy cash flow. So we have both a framework for guidance and some practical ability to work towards achieving the goals that are part of "Reaching Up, Reaching Out and Reaching In." In February, committees will bring their activities to Council, showing how their efforts fit into these three aspects of the Strategic Plan. We will all talk about the next steps for implementing the Plan during February's Council meeting. Please remember that anyone can come to Council, so if you have a topic you would like to put on the agenda, just contact me. You are always welcome.

The congregational meeting on the 6th of January went well, and approved the budget for 2013 plus a constitutional amendment allowing telephone and video conferencing participation at Council meetings. Since the constitution was written before programs like Skype and the availability of so many features on cell phones, it seemed time to allow Council members to participate in the same ways meetings are held in business or during personal activities. Congregational meetings still require members to be present.

In this new year, there are (and will be) several items in the church with a new look. The front ADA doors have been fully funded. Jeff is gathering updated quotes in order to select the right bid and begin installation. A larger screen was installed in the narthex; thanks to Arden, Jeff, James and others who assisted that effort. This enlarged version of the kiosk will interface with the Shepherd website, which Aaron has re-designed and improved with a new appearance and upgraded functionality. Ultimately, the goal will be live streaming for church services. Not only will the podcasts be available on the Shepherd website, but services will also be visible as they occur. So even if we are unable to attend physically, we can still attend virtually via the computer.

This January, we said goodbye to James and Jenny who have moved to Spokane. Thanks to James for his work on Evangelism, and all his other contributions. Shepherd benefitted from his enthusiasm, musicianship and love of technical improvements. Unfortunately, this January also saw the passing of Ken, who will be sorely missed. He was a long-time Shepherd member and served on Council as the Treasurer. He blessed us all with his practical view of life combined with that wry sense of humor. We will all remember the twinkle in his eye when he would tease about something. But we know that Ken is surrounded by the Lord's love and the beauty to come, which is waiting for all of us. We send condolences to his loved ones and are glad that he was part of our lives.

The music program continues to develop at Shepherd with new voices in the choir, new songs during worship and added instruments for special events such as Christmas. Thanks to Pat, Jameson, Tom and everyone who is doing such a great job. The UO Gospel Singers and their band will give a concert on Saturday, February 23rd at 6pm. Shepherd is holding this benefit concert to help them raise money for their trip to China in March. Finally, this newsletter ends with a plea to the congregation for new Sunday school teachers





The Role of Connections: We Get By With a Little Help from Our Friends

"Agreeable society is the first essential in constituting the happiness and, of course, the value of our existence." *Thomas Jefferson*

One of the most important components to happiness, as Thomas Jefferson has pointed out, is having agreeable friends with whom to spend time. Having a diverse social network, according to Dr. Gene Cohen, the director of the Center on Aging, Health and Humanities at George Washington University, is also a factor in



keeping our brains healthy as they age and mature. (It's a protective factor of good mental health at every age.)

Research shows that as we age, we are less likely to suffer fools gladly, and seek out friends we can trust and respect, even while we are also more able to cut those with whom we disagree a little more slack. That may seem like it narrows down the choices for friends, but Dr. Cohen argues for a balanced "social portfolio" with friends drawn from diverse settings. For example, some friends may be those who enjoy going to the theatre, some may be part of a dinner group; some may be docents at a museum or volunteers at a local non-profit.

Dr. Cohen also suggests that some of our activities be high mobility – getting out there and doing things like hiking or golfing, and others be low mobility, like a book club. The high mobility activities are physically good for us and will expose us to different group of friends, and the low mobility activities will protect our time with friends if we become more disabled (less able to hike, for example).

And giving back is one of the most meaningful ways to spend time with friends — working together on a common cause for the good of others. We have lots of ways to help at church, or check out the United Way, which will have lots of other ideas, as well. We all get by with a little help from our friends!

Kindergarten News

In January, we made snowflakes using 2-D shapes. We learned that snowflakes have six sides just like hexagons. We made a snowman glyph and responded in writing to the story, Snowmen At Night. We had snow cones for a snack and also made a snowman snack from a white donut and some candy decorations. We had a pajama day, listened to winter stories, drank hot cocoa, and had French toast sticks. What fun we had! We added a money page to our calendar math books and are learning to recognize pennies, nickels and dimes. We are also learning their value and how to write the number of cents using the cents sign. We practiced telling time to the hour. We have been practicing our letter formation and worked on recognizing those tricky bs, ds, ps, and qs. We practiced stretching out the sounds in words and identifying the middle and ending sounds. We continued working on phonics and are now in book C of the Explode the Code series. We have enjoyed going to chapel with Pastor Randy and learning about Jesus as a child.

February brings us St. Valentine's Day and friendship. We will learn about love in many forms—God's love for us, loving our families and friends, who are neighbors are, and how to care for them. We will begin a food drive to help share God's bounty with our hungry neighbors. We will read the story, Stone Soup and make friendship soup to share at lunchtime. We will have a small

St. Valentine's Day celebration and exchange cards and words of friendship. We will continue stretching words out and recognizing their individual sounds. We will add new popcorn sight words to our memories and continue practicing the ones we have learned. We will add new word families and keep on reading and reading and reading words and sentences. We will count and regroup objects and practice decomposing numbers, finding new ways to make fact families. We will learn names of common 3-D shapes and find everyday examples of them. We will keep working in our calendar math books using our counting, writing, and thinking skills. ADA DOOR UPDATE

Last year the project was quoted with a center post like we currently have. During the course of 2012 more and more need was placed on ADA access. The center post makes it difficult to get a wheel chair through the door along with large items moved in and out. For example, when we host


