# COUNCIL PRESIDENTS REPORT...Submitted by Lee Bonacker

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! By the time you get this newsletter, your holidays will have already occurred. I hope they were wonderful and that you have lots of happy memories.

Before starting on business, I just wanted to emphasize the idea of how important your contribution to SOV is. Every single person is a vital piece of this Body of Christ. God has

brought us all together here, for His reasons. So your ideas, insights and suggestions matter. Please feel free to contact the Executive Committee or myself with any ideas, criticism or "atta-boys". Remember that Council holds open meetings and you can attend to put your two cents worth at any time. You can also send emails via the website. Every effort is made to keep the congregation in the loop via email, the newsletter, the bulletins, announcements at services, Town Hall meetings and Council meetings. If you have another idea to improve communication, bring it up! Communication can always be improved, and what if you have a great idea no one else has thought of?

So, on to the details - Dave is proceeding with the siding replacement and has about 75% of it done. Please remember that the color on both the siding and trim pieces comes from primer. It isn't paint. The building will have to wait for warmer weather to be painted, as temperature effects the flow of the paint. Because the materials are pre-primed, the building will be safe in the winter rains during the waiting period, even if it's not as attractive as it will be. The new siding is a huge improvement over the old, deteriorating siding, as we all can agree. The Building Renewal project continues to stay within its budget, as it was designed to do. There was a set amount available from the refinance, plus a donation. Kudos go to Property Management and Dave for keeping within that amount for all this repair.

**Regarding the easement,** our attorney, Jack Orchard, is still actively working with the city of Beaverton for movement on the issue. Let's keep the prayers going for that effort. After the easement situation with Lazy Boy is resolved, the approved partition can be implemented. Also, the lot can be sold for its highest value, without Lazy Boy's encroachment on SOV property. Selling the lot is important to providing more funds for any new construction that may occur.

Even with the easement problem resolved and the lot sold, the economy still makes the timing and extent of future new construction uncertain. It's time to examine our goals and pray for guidance to readjust them if necessary. This spring is the time to start working on a revised plan for SOV's future. A couple months ago, I reviewed as many planning documents as I could, all the way back to 2002. What was really impressive was how many things actually have been accomplished on those plans. So SOV's planning has proven to be valuable, and not just a "visioning process" without real world application. There has already been a lot of good work done to help provide a starting point for reassessment.

Your thoughts and opinions are extremely important to this whole process. Possible new construction is just a part of the whole SOV picture. Please be thinking about future directions for all SOV activities, because your input will be requested. Of course we don't all agree about everything all the time, but we'll work towards general consensus. Besides, differences of opinion enrich the discussion process and provide alternatives to consider. So do feel free to speak up.

# **Presidents Report Contd.**

KOK's staff problem is resolved with the hiring of other employees, and they are working on increasing the twenty children currently enrolled. KOK starts the enrollment process for the next school year (September 2012) in January, and will have an open house in February. As always, Linda and Wendy deserve all the thanks we can give them for their labor of love in supporting the KOK ministry of SOV. Peggy is now there as well, so let's remember to let them all know how we appreciate them.

The 2012 budget was presented to Council this month. There will be a Town Hall Meeting on January 29<sup>th</sup>, to review and vote on the budget and discuss other issues. In order to make it easier for people from both services to attend, there will be just one church service that day at 10:00 AM. Tammy will provide congregation-wide notice as usual, to remind us.


