Interim Pastor Tom's Message

Dear Fellow Christians,

One of my favorite passages in the Bible is one that is kind of odd. It is Mark 8:22-26. Allow me to quote it in its entirety: "They [Jesus and the disciples] came to Bethsaida. Some people brought a blind man to him [Jesus] and begged him to touch him. He took the blind man by the hand and led him out of the village; and when he had put saliva on his eyes and laid his hands on him, he asked him, 'Can you see anything?' And the man looked up and said, 'I can see people, but they look like trees, walking.' Then Jesus laid his hands on his eyes again; and he looked intently and his sight was restored, and he saw everything clearly. Then he sent him away to his home, saying, 'Do not even go into the village.'"



Quite often we focus so much on Jesus' divinity that we lose sight of his humanity. From time to time we have to "redo" something because we weren't able to do it right the first time. That is very human. Apparently, Jesus didn't get his healing of the blind man right the first time. But after doing it a second time, he succeeded.

I find it oddly comforting that Jesus, the incarnation of God, is so much like me that he had to do things over sometimes, just like I do. Many looked on Jesus' death on the cross as a failure. But his work of salvation, forgiveness, and resurrection was done right. Because of that, I know that even when I fail, Christ is with me, and promises to give me many more chances. I live in the forgiveness of Jesus Christ.
