


- June 27 July 1, 2018 we will be gathering in Houston for the ELCA Youth Gathering.

Interim Pastor Tom's Message

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Summer is approaching. That's great! We've all been looking forward to it. As wonderful as summer is, it's not always an easy time for congregations. Members begin to travel and go on vacation, and giving often goes down because of this absence. So, remember your offering this summer because, certainly, the church's expenses will still be there.



The above paragraph is common in many church notices this time of year. At other times, church councils have to send similar notices to their congregations when gifts have not kept up with expenses, or when special projects are being planned and there is a concern that there may not be enough money for the job.

At such times members of the congregation might be tempted to say, "Oh they're always asking for more money". There's an old joke that is also remembered at times of financial difficulty in a congregation: "The problem is not that we don't have enough money to give for the church's needs. We do have enough. The problem is that it's still in our pockets".

In the past, when I have written or spoken about the financial needs of my congregation I have found myself embarrassed about several things:

My salary is the biggest single item on the budget. It may look to some that the only reason I am talking about giving is because I want to be sure that I get paid. At the same time, there is an expectation that as the Pastor, I should encourage people to give.

Most of the time in my career as a Pastor I've been paid below the Synod suggested guidelines for the salary for a Pastor, sometimes significantly below. This has meant times of hardship for me and my family.

I still make more money than most people in the world. Compared to most people in the world, I am comparatively rich, even in times of hardship for me and my family. When I think of the total resources that God provides for our world, I realize that I am taking more than my share.

I'm not supposed to boast, but I tithe. I give at least 10% of my income to my congregation. I always have. Sometimes that feels like a boast. But I also know that as leader of the church I need to let people know that I do what I hope they would do and that God has provided for me and my family so that we are financially ok.

There are a number of realities concerning our financial gifts to our congregation:

It's not ours, it's God's. We do not truly own the stuff we possess. God has made us "stewards", caretakers, of that stuff. How much does God want in return? 10%? Of our gross or net? God doesn't want 10%, God wants 100%. God wants us to give 100% of the money, time, talent,

skills, land, houses, and everything else we possess to God for the good of the church, our families, and our world. It doesn't belong to us anyway.

Jesus said, "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matt.6:21). We usually interpret that to mean that if we want to see where our heart is, look where we spend our time and money. But there's another way to think about it. Nike says "Just do it". If you just exercise, in this case, even if you don't want to, eventually your habits will change and you will want to do it. Heart follows treasure. If we just give, even if it's hard, even if we don't want to or aren't used to it, eventually we will have a giving habit and we will want to give. We will learn how to give and how much to give.

God has given us responsibility and freedom in our stewardship decisions. Every day God says to us, "Here's the stuff that I have given you. You have the freedom and responsibility to decide how to use it. For church? Good. For charities? Good. For your family? Good. For your country? Good. For the earth? Good. For your own enjoyment? Good."

We need to give, for our sake. Consciously and conscientiously being involved in the stewardship of possessions causes us to be alert to where the Spirit is leading us in God's mission. It reminds us that we are a part of what God is doing in the world. We learn that we can depend on God providing for us and through us. Giving is good for us.

May the Spirit lead you in your stewardship decisions.

"I spent some time thinking of pastor's Sunday sermon—particularly the phrase—-'What does WELLNESS —mean to you'! I could best describe my interpretation of that question by sharing an incident that took place in my life a few months back. I had just boarded the Max train at the Convention Center after an 8-hr work day.

Not long after someone gave me their seating space, I heard

this giggling and laughing coming from somewhere behind me. It

was so refreshing and of course I had to see who was responsible for this laughter and in turning around I saw this beautiful girl with black curly locks and a smile big as a house — maybe 10 years of age—and her little sister and mother. This girl was playing a game of sorts with mother and sister and they were all laughing.

So First I HEARD the JOY and then I SAW the JOY — AND then I saw WELLNESS! — and then—and only then did I see that his beautiful girl was in a

wheelchair—and this beautiful little girl had no legs and her arms only extended

to above the elbows ——but I saw wellness as NEVER before!
Amidst all her diversities ——she was WELL and sharing her joy and love with those around her.

I only wished I could have spent a few minutes with them but they departed at the next stop. This was a special moment in my life. Thank God for this special moment! They say that real life is about these special moments and not about the week in Hawaii or winning the lottery! I BELIEVE IT!"
