

COUNCIL PRESIDENTS REPORT...Submitted by Lee Bonacker

It's a pleasure to report that there are now twelve people on the Strategic Planning Task Force. Thank you to all the people who signed up. It is still not too late to join and we are a bit light for representation on youth issues. These meetings will be open, so you can come and listen to the discussions any time. We are working on the first meeting time in the next week or so, and there will be minutes available so you can follow the progress.

So now I would like to take some time and talk about finance issues. We had the congregational meeting in January and passed a budget with a significant shortfall. That has happened often before, and somehow through the years, SOV's needs have been met and operations hang together through God's grace. Back in 2004, one of the goals for SOV was to have a fully funded budget, which we haven't really achieved in a consistent manner. I think we are suffering from "budget fatigue" a little bit on this subject, too.

So what does a budget really do? It's a best guess on what will happen when trying to pay the bills. The expense part of our budget is very close to the



So I thought it would be useful to let the congregation know what Council has to consider when facing a budget that isn't fully funded. Earlier, when a person wanted to raise funds, they got to determine where the funds were spent. The logic was that if they were going to all the trouble to help raise the funds, they should have a say in where the funds went. In the past two - three years Council has decided that if a fundraising event is held for anything other than Youth events, the money should first go to the general fund to clear up any budget shortfall. After all, how could fund raising monies be accepted before considering paying the bills first? So that decision is directed towards organized fundraising efforts like the rummage sale, for example.

Now does that decision mean that if there is something special you as an individual want to do as a gift for the church, you can't? - of course not. Does that decision mean that you can't do a memorial for someone? - of course not. Does that decision mean that there will be no special projects that would be nice to fund? — of course not. The decision to direct organized fund raising to the general fund is an effort to deal responsibly with the contradictory position presented by a potential shortness of cash.

With a budget, one month may be high and one may be low, and the whole year is part of the picture. As anyone who has a checkbook knows, the actual cash you have available at any specific moment is the most immediate determining factor in whether the bills get paid. At the end of January, there was a very small cash cushion of less than \$600. So Council will be

looking at expenses very carefully in the next couple months and through the summer when Sunday giving is usually low. So, please to look at the figures that Betty puts in the bulletin every week. There is a reason they are there.

Ok, all that being said – guess what? There are some special projects that you will be hearing about. The ADA front doors are proving to be more expensive than the original estimate. You may have already heard about the excellent idea to have a sign board out front, with letters that can be changed. Property management has an estimate for a split HVAC system for the side of the building that can't be vented. It would be nice to have a handrail by the KOK entrance for safety. Is it unusual to have a wish list and still have cash flow issues? Of course not! It's just life.

So now you have a taste of what Council thrashes around in meetings, when considering the subject of money. Of course, your ideas and comments are more than welcome because Council is a representative body and it's all about you. Or should I say, "us" in the Body of Christ sense, because really it's all about Him.

In Mark 12, a scribe comes to ask Jesus, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus answers, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Mark 12:28-30). Jesus responds to the scribe's question with words from the Shema, the passage from Deuteronomy 6 that is recited daily by many of the Jewish faith. These words form a covenant between God and God's people and show us a way to respond to this God who so extravagantly loves us through the cross.
