It was just about one year ago that my time of ministry here at Shepherd of the Valley began. That year has not been exactly what was expected. Although much of the time has been what was anticipated. After all, church is church. There has been the usual getting to know people, trying to remember names, beginning to share in the realities of day to day life together. But much of that has been hampered (at least in my estimation) by my living situation.

That living situation is one of the reasons I thought about those words from Ruth. In the last year I have literally lived the words "where you lodge; I will lodge". I have stayed in the homes of at least seven families of this community of faith for anywhere from one night to weeks at a time. To say that has been an interesting journey would be an understatement. It was not my choice, but it has certainly been a time of learning, learning about patience, trust, faith and the importance and meaning of home.

As I write this it looks like the housing challenge may be coming to an end. (Though I will not be fully convinced until I can once again hang family pictures up.) While I certainly sometimes lamented my situation, there were also times that I remembered to give thanks for a place to lay my head, gave thanks for folks who would open up their homes to this relatively unknown person. That opening up of homes helped to sustain me in a trying time.

But the thing that provided the most strength is that constant that we share. As I wrote above, church is church. As Ruth said, "your people shall be my people, and your God my God." Being together at times of worship, singing together, knowing that through any and all times, to varying degrees at varying times, we share faith in that One. Children of God, a community of faith, always and again turning to the cross and the resurrection of the Christ, and that love that sustains us.

It has been an interesting time, and will remain so, as will the God that brings us together.



SCRIPT FUNDRAISER...Submitted by Linnea Harmon

In case you haven't heard the news, Shepherd of the Valley has established a Scrip Program. What is "Scrip" you might ask! Scrip means substitute money, and that is exactly what it is. It is a debit gift card or paper gift certificates for specific stores, restaurants, and services. It is a dollar for dollar exchange and costs the buyer nothing!

Why would SOV do this, how do we make any money? It's simple, really. If you buy a \$50 gift certificate for Fred Meyer, you give SOV \$50. SOV then, in turn, buys the certificate for \$46, and gives the certificate to you. Some of the stores pay us a 4% return and some pay us much more! It all varies and is detailed on the order form. In April, our first order month, we bought \$3,000 in scrip and received \$175 for the general fund!

Next question: Where do you get the order form? It is on our website and also available at church. Just complete your order form and turn it in with your check made out to SOV. There is a box in Tammy's office or you can give your order to Linnea or Clara. We will be accepting orders from now until May 16 with delivery of the scrip on Sunday, May 23. Jump on the band wagon! It's a simple fund raiser to benefit SOV.

Gifting Stock made simple through the ELCA Foundation Submitted by Diane Lewis

Gifting stock is one option that we have as an opportunity in giving to our church. Giving the stock through the ELCA has several advantages. It is easy to accomplish, the fees are lower, in some cases it can be done over the phone and the transaction fees are less. If the stock has appreciated then you can gift stock to the church and not have any capital gains from the appreciation as well as take the entire gift as a tax deduction. The ELCA Foundation has made a good effort to keep this simple. Some financial brokerage businesses won't charge you to transfer the stock. The only fees will come from a small charge from the ELCA Foundation and the brokerage firm that handles the sale of the stock. The stock is sold immediately and the balance is sent directly to the church with the information of who has donated the stock. The one gifting the stock is sent written communication of the total value of the stock when it is sold as well as the amount that is sent to the church after the fees are deducted.

Here are the easy steps in gifting a stock to Shepherd of the Valley:

- 1. Contact your stock broker and give the name and amount of the stock you want transferred. Ask if that firm has a transfer fee for non profit transfers.
- 2. Give the broker the information for gifting to the ELCA Foundation (Wells Fargo Advisors, DTC Clearing #0141, FBO Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, Account # 5103-9400)
- 3. Inform Shawn Greene (ELCA 1-800-638 8322 ex.2976) as to the exact date and the shares that are being transferred out of your account. Let her know that the funds are to be sent to Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church, Beaverton, OR. This can also be done by email to: shawn.greene@elca.org
- 4. Once the stock is transferred it will be immediately sold. The small fees are taken out of the sale price and the remaining funds are sent to the church with a letter from the ELCA stating who is from.
- 5. The person gifting will receive a letter of confirmation from the ELCA with the full tax deductible amount of the sale.
- 6. Contact SOV's financial secretary about how you want the money designated.

If you have questions, please feel free to talk to Diane Lewis or call the ELCA Foundation directly. They are very willing to help members navigate through this process.
