
November Newsletter Article

The Role of Education in Promoting Brain Health: Learn to Live Well

Robert Katzman was the chair of neurology at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York in the early 1980's. In his work, he worked patients suffering from dementia, and did a study in 1988 to see if the level of plaque and tangles in the brains of deceased patients matched their level of cognitive decline. He found that it did – except for one group of patients – those in "Group A" who had lots of tangles and plaque without significant dementia. Other studies went on to discover a key to those in that group: education, including a large study in China, where Dr. Katzman "found that those with no education had twice the risk of

developing dementia than those who had attended middle school or even elementary school. Similar results were later found in population surveys of dementia rates in France, Italy, Sweden, and Israel.

Another neuroscientist, Yaakov Stern, at Columbia College of Physicians and Surgeons, published a study in 1994 in the *Journal of the American Medical Association* with similar conclusions. "We found that those with less than eight years of education were twice

#### **Preschool News**



## WARMING SHELTERS

Two warming shelters are opening to provide homeless adults age 18+ years who are living on our streets and in campsites with a hot meal and overnight shelter from the heavy rain and cool temperatures that have descended upon Washington County. These two shelters will be open one-evening per week - see details for dates, times, and location below. The Severe Weather Shelter Response Plan will be fully activated when the weather reaches freezing levels (www.noaa.gov or http://www.accuweather.com/).

St. Anthony's Catholic Church **Tualatin:** Rolling Hills Community Church

These community partners are providing this "life-saving" service of food and shelter, and welcome community support. People may volunteer their time and/or donate food, new blankets, Tri-Met bus/MAX tickets, and monetary donations to offset the utility and operation costs of the shelter - please make donations directly to the shelter of your choice.
