PASTOR'S PAGE

"...let the wise also hear and gain in learning..." Proverbs 1:5

That is one way of saying that learning is a life long process. While I may know that, the fact also is that is has to be relearned over and over again. (Learning what we already know may seem more than a bit redundant, but then old things

continue to speak to me in new ways.)

Reminded of that in so many ways. Like sitting with our school kids for chapel. Do I still remember the tune for this song that I have sung hundreds of times (but not once in the last four months)? And these little ones here for the first time. I must start over again too. And yet they teach me, and encourage me, as their eyes light up, and they grin and giggle nervously, and I get to tell them all over again that "Yes, Jesus loves you!"

The chance to learn continues here in this building that houses part of the ministry of SOV. Sunday school has started again, for kids and adults. The adult class is continuing to delve into the Gospel according to St. Matthew. No matter how many times I have done that there are still more nuggets to be found. Learning and relearning.

Thinking of all our Sunday school teachers (remembering the folks who taught me as well) and how important that task is. Something that began last year, and continues with even more emphasis this year, is a confirmation program (for some pre-confirmation) taught by Tom B. and Mark V. They are trekking through the Old and New Testaments using the "Here We Stand" material becomes a wasteland between childhood and adult education. (Thinking of asking them to share in the adult time a bit too, but I haven't broached that with them yet).

There are Stacey and Caitlin, teaching by being present with our junior and senior high youth. Our choir teaching with songs of praise. Fellowship teaching us the importance of hospitality week after week. Stewardship calling us to look at our blessings and the ways in which we may share them. Social concerns picking up the same theme of looking beyond ourselves because there is so much to learn out there, by offering ourselves and being present with all kinds of other folks. No matter how "wise" we may become, there is always more to learn. Lord, help us to be open to the task and the opportunity, as teachers and students both.

"Just show up!" That theme from Pastor Randy's sermon has been resonating with me ever since he said it. The message wasn't "be perfect first and then show up." 2 Corinthians 12:9 says "...My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness..." That verse makes the message, "just show up," both challenging and comforting at the same time.

So I wanted to take time to thank all the people who are "showing up" and contributing to the

SOV body in so many ways and with so many talents. There are people who have skill and dedication with children and education, like the KOK Board members, Parish Ed, and the Sunday school teachers. (We have an ongoing need for more people to "just show up" and help teach Sunday school.) The youth program run by Stacy and Caitlin has grown so much in this second year that there will now be two groups so kids closer to the same age can be together. How exciting is that? Remember when we didn't even have a youth program?

Corrine, who said this month that each week she has several requests for in home services.


Thanks to Property Management for coordinating the building renewal repairs. It took longer than expected for the window order to "just show up" (there are about 60 units involved). The windows will be delivered this week and will be stacked inside for a few days. Dave says that it will take about four days to get the windows in, then two weeks for the siding, and then a week of dry weather for painting. Since the siding is pre-primed, rain will not hurt it. We just want everything finished, so let's all pray for a dry stretch when it's time for the contractor to paint.

The Memorial Committee deserves thanks for finishing their procedures and continuing work on the Ann Smith and Kurt Rizer memorials. This is a long-term committee which can have an increasingly more important function as SOV develops an endowment fund. Another long-term committee is the Building Committee, which Council formally thanked for their years of work in a motion passed last week. Because of the uncertainty of the economy, the motion asked for a hold on new design work and/or expenses until after February, 2012. (The Building Committee was already holding off on those activities, anyway.) The Building Committee had asked for some direction from Council, and the motion gives everyone time to get the building renewal project finished, plus get past budgeting work and the holidays. Work on the easement and partition issues of course, would remain ongoing. The full motion is available in the September Council minutes if you want to read it.


A final note of thanks to Betty, for her timely notice on a potential general budget funds shortfall. I'm happy to report that funds in excess of the need came in last week, showing again that God will meet all our needs in Christ Jesus. We were able to pay all the bills and live up to our other obligations, like Synod support. Betty also organized a craft fair to raise funds for the general budget. 17 vendors participated and indicated that they would like to come back next year. Her original idea took a lot of work and could develop into a nice event for the future.

Endowment & Memorial Committee

The Endowment & Memorial committee has been busy working on finding uses for two recent memorials.

The first memorial is to replace our failing organ with a better instrument in memory of Ann Smith. The Family of Ann Smith is providing support, along with others to make that happen. The committee is currently in the process of selecting an instrument and should have a decision shortly on what to purchase.

The second memorial is in memory of Pastor Kurt Rizer. We are in contact with family and working to determine what would be a suitable memorial in memory of Kurt.

Memorials are gifts that are given to the church in memory of someone and are intended to be spent immediately to enhance the mission of the church. One of the tasks of the committee is to identify in advance what needs the church has that might be acceptable for funding from a memorial gift.

Endowment gifts area third way to give to the church. First priority is regular Sunday offerings. Second priority is fund raisers such as Tanzania Missions some years ago or the Capital Campaign more recently.

The Endowment Fund, which is kept separate from the Memorial Funds, has received its first gift of almost \$500. In ten years we would like to see that number have three more zeros behind it. A fund of that size would generate investment income of \$20,000 per year forever, the principal is not spent. This could be used for scholarships, foreign missions, support of church universities, and other missions of the church. Typically the major sources of gifts for endowments come from member's estates as a pre-planned gift, although gifts may be made anytime. In the coming year we will be providing you with information on how you can plan to support the Endowment Fund.
