What a wonderful summer – I hope you have all been enjoying it and didn't suffer too much during the hottest times we have had. There are a lot of things to be thankful for during these last weeks of summer – Hermiston melons top my food list right now.

Another excellent thing to be thankful for is that Jameson will be staying as Music Director for this next year. He has brought expertise and a fresh insight into music at Shepherd of the Valley. He has been trying out new music this summer, and refreshing the performance on familiar music. So look for more of that special Shepherd music blend – traditional hymns, contemporary pieces and a bit of gospel. It's all about worship and how nice to be able to worship is so many musical vernaculars.

Again this August, Betty organized the Arts and Crafts Fair and it was well attended with 32 vendors. That's almost twice as many as the first time, which was last year. Thanks to Betty (and everyone who helped) for sharing their passion with us, and pulling this event together by dedicating all that time and effort.

The Task Force has discussed several venues for dissemination; so they will keep you all notified when the document is ready and let you know how it will be made available. Remember that your comments matter. The Plan is for all of us and by all of us for Shepherd's future. So please do contribute your thoughts and insights so we can build a guiding document that we can all work together to implement.

Summer Sunday services traditionally are lightly attended, and for some weeks that has been true this year as well. So it's not unusual for summer to be a difficult financial time for the church. In fact, I don't remember a time when the month of July wasn't in the red. But this year is different. We finished July in the black, which is a shock. We were able to catch up on our Synod commitment as well. Wow! Now why do I get surprised when God fills all our needs in Christ Jesus? 
The first class of this 10 class series will be September 16th.

September: Understanding the Healthy Brain:

"We are Fearfully and Wonderfully Made"

"I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well." Psalm 139:14

Our brains are amazing organs that help us breathe and move (even when asleep), process sights, sounds, tastes, and smells, as well as process physical and emotional feelings. They help us process language and communicate through speech, the written word, music, or other arts. They alert us to when we are in danger from sickness or external threats and they process our pain. They



remember things for us. They also age, and they die along with us. Truly, we are fearfully and wonderfully made.

Come join SOV's adult class as we go on a journey through the fall, winter, and spring to explore the brain and what we can do together to promote brain health, as well as to strengthen our spiritual lives together. "This is Your Brain On God" will look at how the brain works, and explore the impact of various factors on brain health, including exercise, life-long learning, nutrition, family and friends, living in the moment while leaving a legacy, and the central role of faith in all of the above. Over the months ahead, we will have some speakers from the community, and other resources for you. We encourage you to join us in learning more, and making life-sustaining tweaks here or there to protect your fearful and wonderful brain!
